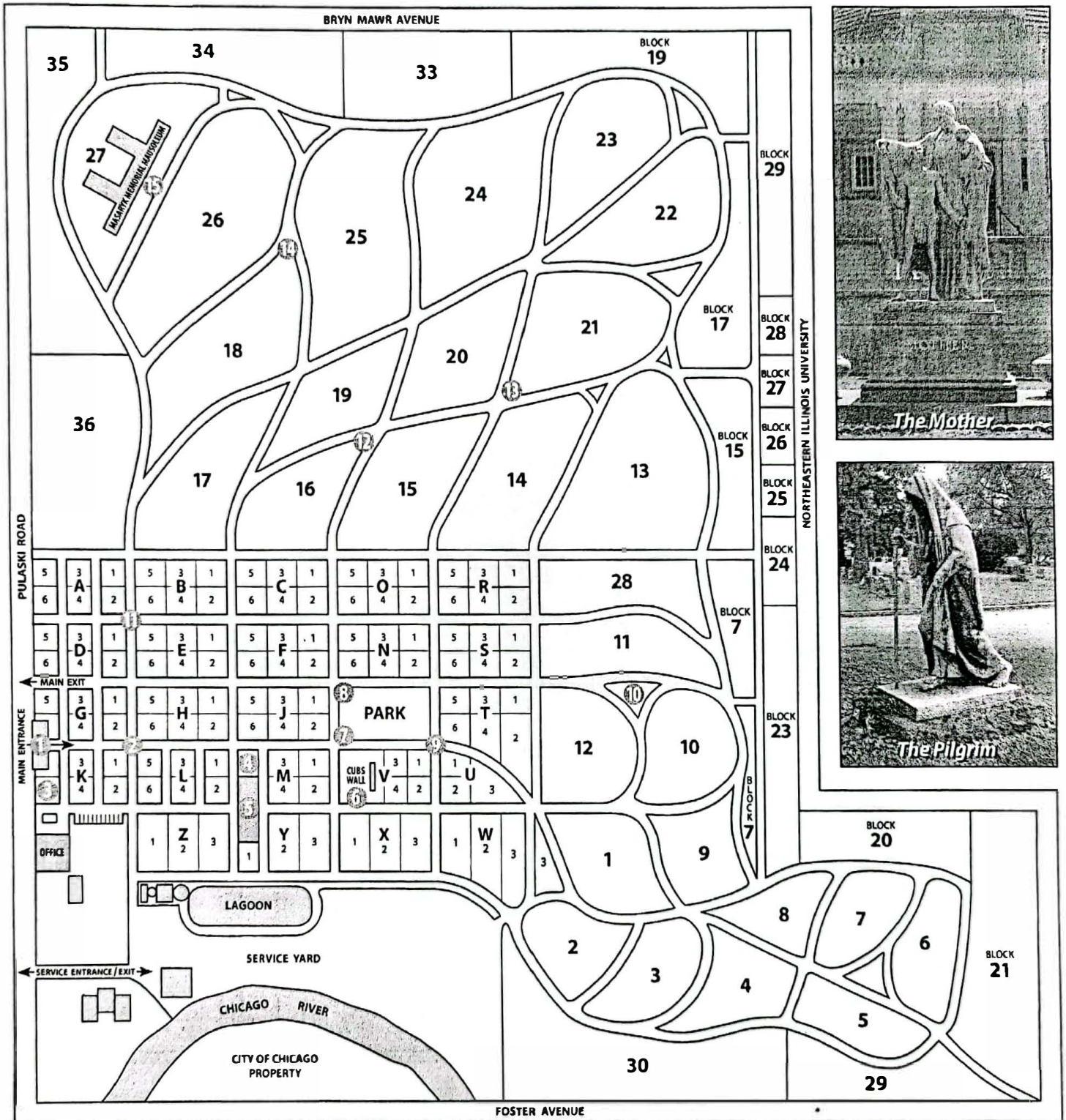


# Historical Points of Interest at Bohemian National Cemetery



- 1 The Gatehouse entrance was designated a historical landmark in 1977.
- 2 Our World War Memorial has a special flag pole honoring one of our War Veterans of World War I and World War II each day of the year.
- 3 The grave of Joseph Lahvic, the first grave digger at the cemetery.
- 4 Statue "The Mother" by Albin Polasek, noted Czech sculptor.
- 5 The CREMATORY BUILDING, erected in 1913.
- 6 The CUBS WALL, final resting place for diehard Cubs fans.
- 7 Plaque honoring N. Brada, a baby, the first burial at our cemetery.
- 8 The ODD FELLOWS MONUMENT is located in our open park area.
- 9 The CIVIL WAR VETERANS MEMORIAL, dedicated in May 1892.

- 10 SPANISH AMERICAN WAR MEMORIAL known as the HIKER.
- 11 KLACEL CIRCLE. Some of the guiding forces in Czech-American history are buried within this circle.
- 12 Victims of the EASTLAND DISASTER are buried in Section 16. EASTLAND CENTENNIAL MEMORIAL, dedicated July 2015.
- 13 CERMAK FAMILY MAUSOLEUM. Anton Cermak was Mayor of Chicago from 1931 to 1933 until assassinated while in office.
- 14 Statue "The Pilgrim" by Albin Polasek.
- 15 The MASARYK MEMORIAL MAUSOLEUM named after and dedicated to the memory of T.G. Masaryk, the founder and first President of the Czechoslovak Republic.
